It also includes the existing district map that was adopted back in 2017.

Please note that the City will be conducting an in person Workshop for Redistricting on Saturday, 10/16/21 between 10:00-2:00 p.m. Every 10 years new census data is released and we are required to assess the existing district makeup and review for compliance with current laws. Demonstrations on mapping along with consultant demographers will be present to discuss and assist with mapping operations.
