San Dieguito Board Recognizes Landscape Contest Winners

The San Dieguito Water District Board of Directors recognizes the Kessler Family for winning the District's 2022 WaterSmart Landscape Contest. This annual competition rewards water-efficient landscapes created by customers of participating water agencies.

North County Water Agencies Offer Low-Cost Rain Barrels

To encourage water conservation as drought conditions persist, Carlsbad Municipal Water District, Olivenhain Municipal Water District, San Dieguito Water District, and Santa Fe Irrigation District have partnered to offer discounted rain barrels to area residents this fall. Collecting rainwater for future use not only can save drinking water and money, but also reduces irrigation runoff that can carry pollutants into local waterways and beaches.

Fifty-gallon barrels are on sale for \$97, with a final cost of \$62 after a \$35 rebate. Rain barrels ordered from October 1 to November 30 will be available for pick up at Solana Center for Environmental Innovation located at 137 North El Camino Real in Encinitas.

To qualify, household income must be at or below 60% of the State Median Income or a household member is a current recipient of CalFresh or CalWORKs.
