Draft 2019 ADA Transition Plan includes:

Barriers to Accessibility identified in the Self-Evaluation Plan

 Accessible features as part of the City's/District's capital improvement projects and other accessible projects.

Transition Plan Review

Criteria for prioritizing removal of barriers:

- Prioritization based on public access to schools, hospitals, public meeting rooms, gathering centers and rehab centers.
- Council Strategic Plan for 2017-2019 (Improve connectivity and mobility for all users)
- 3/9/19, Council identified a three tier Capital Improvement Program Priority system. Tier 1 with highest priority and with identified funding have been added to the Transition Plan.

- (2) New curb ramps and alley apron, two sidewalk kick-outs and new alley apron on west side of Newcastle avenue just north of intersection improvements.





Transition Plan Review – Public Works

Ongoing City Wide Cement Maintenance

FY2018-19 Repaired 19,314 Sq.' of concrete

Mitigate reported sidewalk deviations within 24 hrs.

Inspect and mitigate sidewalk repairs in (3) Work Zones annually

Annual Repair Budget

Contractual: General Fund Asphalt and Cement \$155,598.

In-House: General Fund Asphalt and Cement Materials \$75,495
