SEGMENTS B & C: BASIL ST. TO LA COSTA AVE.

PROJECT AREA

The Safety & Mobility Enhancements project will create dedicated bike lanes by restriping the existing lanes and reducing the highway to one vehicle lane in each direction. This project will also modify the medians surrounding the Leucadia Boulevard intersection where two vehicle lanes are needed in each direction.

The City has completed construction of Segment A North (Phase 1) improvements on North Coast Highway 101 between Marcheta Street and Basil Street.



PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Leucadia Streetscape Project includes a number of improvements aimed at preserving and revitalizing 2.5 miles of North Coast Highway 101 between A Street and La Costa Avenue. Project construction comes after over 15 years of work by City staff and the Leucadia community to create a plan that makes it easier and safer for community members to get to the beach, and enjoy the shops and restaurants on North Coast Highway 101, whether in a car, on a bike or on foot.

PROJECT STATUS

The Safety and Mobility Enhancements project was approved by the Encinitas City Council in **June 2021**. Construction started in **July 2022** and is anticipated to be completed by **late 2022**.

PROJECT BUDGET

The Safety and Mobility Enhancements project has a total construction phase cost of \$1.7 million. Funding has been provided by the City's general fund and SANDAG TransNet funds, the region's half cent sales tax for local transportation projects.

This project will bring consistent striping and a contiguous separated bike lane throughout the entire length of the Leucadia Streetscape project corridor in a quick and cost-effective way.
