We observe that climate change is altering precipitation patterns, potentially diminishing existing water supplies. Future conditions will continue to change and require ongoing adjustment and adaptation by water managers. Changes in supply patterns require costly adaptations.

Traditionally, SDWD customers have received a blend of approximately 30% local water from Lake Hodges, water that we receive in the form of local rainfall. However, due to restrictions, SDWD now has limited access to this cost-effective resource, which increases the cost of supplying water.

Air Vacuum & Blow Off Replacement Project: Phase 1

The Project will replace aging air release and drain valves for District's water transmission pipeline along Encinitas Blvd between El Camino Real and Rancho Santa Fe Road and along Rancho Santa Fe Road from Encinitas Blvd to El Camino del Norte. These critical infrastructure improvements are necessary to continue providing reliable water service. Construction activities expected intermittently through early June 2024.

Traffic delays are expected during construction due to partial lane closure. In addition, water will be released into the gutters and streets on Encinitas Blvd., East of El Camino Real, and other possible locations to facilitate installation of new pipeline appurtenances.

Valve Replacement Project Completed

The project replaced 67 valves located within 23 intersections in Old Encinitas. These valves had been identified by staff to be in poor operating conditions. The completion of this projects helps increase operational efficiencies and will decrease customer impacts during future shutdowns for both routine maintenance and emergency situations.
